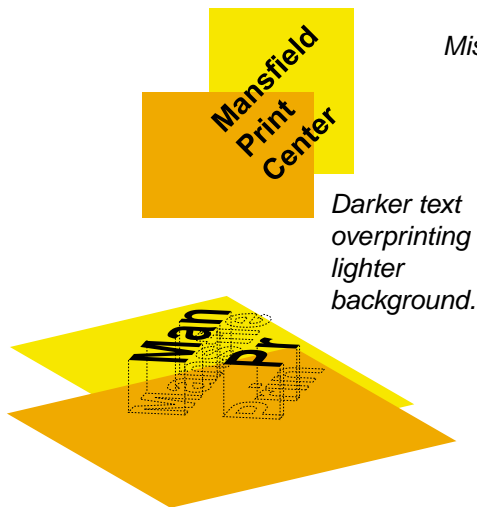


TRAPPING

overprint vs. knockout

overprint

Darker inks overprint lighter colors. There is no need for trapping; however, the opacity of the ink determines how much the under color shows through the darker color. If the darker color is fairly translucent, there may be a noticeable darkening of the upper color where the lighter color is overprinted. CMYK files overprint automatically.

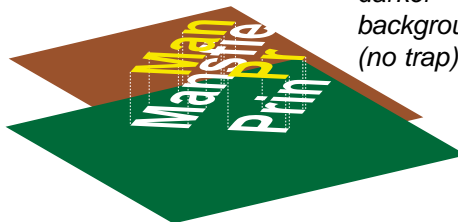


Darker text overprinting lighter background.

Lighter text knocking out darker background (no trap).



knockout & trap

Lighter colors knockout darker background colors. This process requires a “trap” to prevent slight misregistration on press. Traps are usually created by overprinting a slight stroke around perimeter of object. Vector files with spot colors need traps created, and can be done – by specifying the stroke to “overprint” and the “fill” to knockout – in the attributes dialog box.
